## THE PRAYER OF GREAT THANKSGIVING

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

## It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is truly right and our greatest joy to give you thanks and praise, O Lord our God, creator and ruler of the universe. In your wisdom, you made all things and sustain them by your power. You formed us in your image, setting us in this world to love and to serve you.

# When we rebelled against you, refusing to trust and obey you, you did not reject us, but still claimed us as your own. You sent prophets to call us back to your way.
