


You made a difference in the World!

We received the Investment Tax Credit check of \$32,206.99 for our solar panel system. This money will be returned to our Reserve Fund. Additionally PCOR is saving about \$11,000 per year on PG&E electrical cost. Thank you for your support of this project.


We started the year with robust giving and now our giving is 11% below our 2024 budget. Thank you for including PCOR on your Christmas gift list.


Peggy Trotter Dammond Preacely Acclaimed Freedom Rider, Civil Rights Activist, Artist and Speaker Is coming to Santa Rosa! Saturday February 1, 2025

Čo-sponsored by The Saturday Afternoon Club and The Nubian Café Collective

Honoring the first day of Black History Month 2025, we are privileged to host Ms. Preacely for a presentation that is open to the public. This is a unique opportunity to hear first-hand about the historic Civil Rights Movement. Ms. Preacely's history:

- * Former Freedom Rider and working member of the historic Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).
- * Jailed in Maryland and Georgia. She worked in communities across the Deep South to facilitate community empowerment and register Black voters in under-served rural communities.
- * At the march in Washington when Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his legendary "I Have a Dream" speech that precipitated the Voting Rights A et of 1964.
- * Continued her activism in the North by working against the de facto segregation of schools in Boston.
- * Descendant of a historic, multi-faceted family tree. Among her ancestors are:
 - Mary Hemmings Bell, sister of Sally Hemmings,
 - William Monroe Trotter, early civil right activist, His home is a National Historic Landmark.
 - Great-great granddaughter of famed abolitionists, Ellen and William Craft who escaped
 - enslavement in 1850's Atlanta by disguising themselves as a white slave-owner and his slave.
- * Sits on the Board of the Monticello 'Getting Word' Advisory Board, comprised of descendants of those enslaved at Monticello.
