Have an Abundant Summertime?

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." (John 10:10)

So, who is this "thief" in this passage? From a psychological perspective, you can credit your id for behaving like a thief. Freud divided the human psyche into three functional parts: the id, ego, and superego. The id is a "dark," "inaccessible" (unconscious), non-rational component of the psyche that seeks pleasure and is responsible for greedy, selfish, and destructive behaviors in order to get what it wants.

The superego, on the other hand, is the moral conscience arising from an internalized ethical authority. The ego's function is to resolve this internal conflict so that the id can satisfy its drives in a socially/morally acceptable manner. To accomplish the latter function, the ego maintains a grasp on reality (the external world), navigating the headwaters of reality to fulfill its function in society.

New research of the brain hypothesizes that the parts of the brain responsible for these functions can be identified and treated if one part is overactive and causing problems. The article: "Freud's Brain" by Dr. Elliot Cohen in the March 2020



Psychology Today states that future mental health treatment might involve enhancing the parts of the brain that are deficient in their ability to balance the effort to meet ones needs with socially acceptable behavior. Rather than a person going to jail for murder there might be a treatment in the future that will alter that person's brain in the region that caused them to act on their id impulse to murder. In the old days, lobotomy was used for brain disorders. Now there may be a more humane way to help a mentally disordered person become one who contributes positively to society. By enhancing the ego and superego in a way that balances out the overactive id, the person would be happier, and they would fit into society better without self-destructive or other-destructive tendencies.

However, since this type of treatment is not yet available, we can promote the medicine described in the Bible! The prescription in John 10:10 combats the overactive id by encouraging us to imitate and trust in Jesus. Trust that Jesus came to give abundant life. And when we try our best to be as much like Jesus as possible, then we will be happier, healthier, and bless others with abundant life, too. There is no need to act primitively selfish and greedy to survive in this world. You will reap more abundance by being helpful, empathic, compassionate, humble, and understanding towards others.

Summertime is a time to rest, enjoy the outdoors, and embrace the beauty of nature. God hopes you will enjoy abundant life in the days you have left here on earth. Each day is precious, and we are to use our days to bless others, be thankful, and demonstrate our love of Christ by loving all creatures, even those who are hard to love. Then when our days are done, we can look forward to hearing God's affirmation: "Well done, good and faithful servant."

What do you consider an abundant life? The Bible was not promoting wealth or the accumulation of material things. What non-material things can produce an abundance in life for you?

I will spend the summer planning for the coming season—finding new music and combining that with old favorites. This is only one part of my job that I love! Music is so important—especially in our present world. It's essential to keep in touch with our hearts, and nothing achieves that goal better or quicker than music! I'm also working on planning our upcoming **Choral Retreat on August 25th,** and the **Allan Petker Choral Workshop scheduled for Saturday, September 28th.** The invitations have gone out into the community of church choirs, and we hope to gather somewhere between 50 and 70 choral singers with many churches represented. This is a wonderful way to learn some new music introduced by a new choral director and receive his pearls of musical wisdom—it can be very energizing to the singers. I'm really looking forward to this! As I mentioned in the last Rose Clippings, on that day there will be a short concert at 5:00 p.m. when all of the singers participating in the workshop will sing the four pieces they spent the whole day preparing. Please plan to come and support these choral singers who provide the music every Sunday morning during the worship service.

We are also planning a **Handbell Clinic** led by our own Jessie Arriola, who has lots of experience leading and participating in bell choirs. This clinic will take place on **Sunday, September 8th from 12:00 to 3:00 p.m.** The choir is coming back into church that day so many of the bell ringers will be in attendance. We'll have a quick lunch after coffee hour and then start the clinic at noon. We'll cover handbell techniques and learn a short new piece. This clinic is open to anyone who is interested in learning more about handbell ringing—we'll be offering it to churches with handbell choirs in the community.

Join us Friday evening for a BBQ and teaching presentations led by David and Joanne Del Castillo. Finance Committee Report


We have filed for the ITC (Investment Tax Credit) of \$35,000 for our fully paid solar system. The IRS (Internal Revenue Service) informed us that it may take up to a year to receive payment. When payment is received it will be returned to our Reserve Fund.

Tax laws and our own personal tax situation continues to change. Have you considered:


- Qualified Charitable Deduction QCD can be a tax exempt part of a Minimum Required Distribution (MRD);


