


## THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

#### **Finance Committee Report**

Please see the graph below prepared by Bill Nakata that shows that as of January 31, 2025, our church income exceeds our expenses by \$1,976 – hurray! This is largely due to our church giving exceeding our budgeted giving by \$1,623, or almost 7%.

#### The Finance Committee has set the following four goals for 2025:

- 1. Achieve a balanced budget so that our church's annual income is equal to or exceeds our annual expenses. We accomplished this for the first time in many years in 2024 and are hoping to repeat this again in 2025. This is very ambitious considering that the 2025 budget predicts a net loss of \$8,060 for 2025, but we believe in miracles!
- 2. Achieve a 50% rate or higher of church participation in fulfilling the "per capita obligation." Our participation rate in 2024 was 36%. We believe we can do better! You will hear more announcements about this over the coming weeks and months ahead. If you are not sure if you have paid your "per capita obligation," you can check with Nancy Morgan and she will let you know.
- 3. Begin our stewardship campaign for 2026 by September 2025.
- 4. Increase both oral and written communication between the finance committee and members of the church regarding church finances.

Presbyterian Church of the Roses was blessed to have Peggy Preacely as guest preacher to begin Black History Month on February 1. Peggy is a civil rights activist from Long Beach whose history includes being arrested as a teen

for sitting at a lunch counter, being a Freedom Rider and marching with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. She is a community organizer, author and poet who has written two books. Her sermon was inspirational and laced with poetry from some of Peggy's favorite hymns.

Those attending worship on Sunday, February 8 heard the first public performance of "In Quiet" composed by Robert Howard Ott and arranged for handbells by Nick Rankin. It was exquisitely performed by Bellissimo under the direction of Jessie Arriola. Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday is a time of repentance and reflection. Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance and the placing of ashes on the forehead is a traditional part of Ash Wednesday services. Our Ash Wednesday service will begin at 5:30 pm. The 40 days of Lent reminds us of the time Jesus went into the wilderness to pray. The Worship Committee encourages daily devotions to lead us in prayer and reflection as we all try to align our thoughts and priorities with our understanding of God's will.

We received a few devotions from members of the congregation to share. Look for them in this and possibly future issues of Rose Clippings. Following is a devotion Jessie Arriola offered at the last meeting of the Worship Committee.

Philippians 4:4-7

Rejoicing focused in the Lord is perpetual, not episodic or seasonal. More than urging a rejoicing about the Lord, the rejoicing is done in the presence of the Lord. In the Lord is where we can safely rejoice. Rejoicing is not a naïve denial of hardship. Nor is it slapping a happy face on every moment of the day. Rejoicing in the Lord takes the shape of being gentle to everyone because the Lord is near and present. Rejoicing in the Lord can be living without anxiety because God is not distant. God attends to prayers and supplications and thus rejoicing includes making known our requests to God. And, the call to rejoice always in the Lord is guarded by the

peace of God. When hearts are disturbed and joy muted, the reach their limits, the peace of God quiets our anxiety and makes

peace of God generates rejoicing. When our minds reach their limits, the peace of God quiets our anxiety and makes room for rejoicing.

God, grant us your peace and quiet our hearts and minds so that we may flourish in rejoicing. Amen.

Montgomery High School (MHS) Breakfast Program: Thanks to our Breakfast Angels for keeping our MHS students happy

and nourished every school day! We are still distributing between 50-60 breakfast burritos per day—now with a turkey sausage option. We are supportive to the students with the challenge of the potential of MHS being closed. We are awaiting the City of Santa Rosa School District's decision on which schools will be closed by the end of February. The Program is being challenged with increased egg costs. Please know we always accept donations for the breakfast program. We do need more volunteers, especially for Wednesdays and alternates for Mondays through Fridays. Thank you for your continued contributions to the **Cents-Ability** collection baskets in the Narthex and Campbell Court on the **second Sunday of every month**. The collection is for the Presbytery Hunger Fund. We are able to keep 25 percent of the contributions which will go toward the Montgomery High School Breakfast fund. We submitted an application for a Hunger Task Force Cents-Ability Grant for \$5000 on January 12, 2025.

As an **Earth-Care Congregation**, we continue to mentor and learn how to be better stewards of our planet. An application was submitted on January 17, 2025 to be recertified as an Earth-Care Congregation.



#### Earth Day is April 22, 2025!

The Committee received a thank you for our \$500 donation to the Black Mountain Presbyterian Church in North Carolina after the Hurricane Helene disaster.

The Committee sent a **Fire Relief Donation of \$500 to the Pacific Palisades Presbyterian Church** which was destroyed in the Los Angeles fires last month.

We were honored to have **Peggy Preacely** participate in church service on February 2nd to celebrate Black History Month. Ms. Preacely is an icon of the Civil Rights Movement, a Freedom Rider, active member of Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, and worked with John Lewis and Julian Bond. Ellen and Chris Bowen graciously hosted lunch at their home so committee members could talk further with Peggy Preacely. I personally left our visit feeling so much more hopeful on hearing her call for kindness and peaceful activism. Norm Smith received a call from Ms. Preacely requesting a copy of our church's sermon she gave on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, as she had received word that she is receiving a recognition award from the Southern California senators for her continual work and message for everyone's rights.

The next Special Offering will be One Great Hour of Sharing. The collection will be on *Easter Sunday*, April 20, 2025.


# Director of Music

Think of all the synapses that need to fire in order to sing well ... there's pitch, tone, breath, language, blend, ability to sing harmony next to someone singing another part, memory, and the list goes on. All that has to happen simultaneously! Then there's the camaraderie of singers that are all working toward the same goal – making beautiful music.

This is a great time to step up and join the choir! Or maybe you always wanted to play the handbells? The last concert on the Roses Signature Concert Series is the Good Friday Concert. This year we will present Mozart's sublime Requiem. The choral ensemble, Cantiamo Sonoma, some members of the Chancel Choir, and selected members of the community will join us once again, and there will be a large chamber orchestra. The Requiem is scored for 2 bassett horns (these days clarinets are used), 2 bassoons, 2 trumpets, 3 trombones, a string quartet plus a double bass, timpani and organ. Mozart started composing the Requiem in Vienna in 1791, but was unable to finish it because he died that same year December. There is much mystery surrounding Mozart's life during this time, but we have a completed version of the Requiem by his student, Franz Xaver Süssmayr, and that is the version that



is generally used in the present day. Be sure to add this to your calendar Friday, April 18th at 7:30 p.m. – it's one of the gems of choral literature!





#### **Devotional for Lent 2025**

Matthew 7:12 - "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you, for this is the Law and the Prophets."

Reporters and city officials gathered at a Chicago railroad station one afternoon in 1953. The person they were meeting was the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize winner. A few minutes after the train came to a stop, a giant of a man — six-feet-four — with bushy hair and a large moustache stepped from the train. Cameras flashed. City officials approached him with hands outstretched. Various ones began telling him how honored they were to meet him.

The man politely thanked them and then, looking over their heads, he asked if he could be excused for a moment. He quickly walked through the crowd until he reached the side of an elderly black woman who was struggling with two large suitcases. He picked up the bags and with a smile escorted the woman to a bus. After helping her aboard, he wished her a safe journey. Returning to the greeting party he apologized, "Sorry to have kept you waiting."

The man was Dr. Albert Schweitzer, the famous missionary doctor who had spent his life helping the poor in Africa. In response to Schweitzer's action, one member of the reception committee said with great admiration to the reporter standing next to him. "That's the first time I ever saw a sermon walking."



MY LENTEN STORY: (Psalm 23)

EVERY evening of the year, not just during Lent, my short Prayer thanks God for the Day, even when it's not "good"!! My story explains why:

In early December 2001 (23 years ago), a home accident in the garage saw my foot at the ankle snap off my right leg, attached to leg only by Skin. In early January 2002, due to not exercising broken foot enough, Blood clots formed, passed through my heart, onto top of lung openings, creating a Tiple Pulmonary Embolism. Nothing could be done At the hospital, but take a "wait and see" attitude that no more clots Would form and travel to heart or lungs, and the 3 clots on my lungs Would dissolve. I could have died that night.

The next morning I woke up, finding 4 doctors, including hospital director, standing at foot of my bed, grins so wide across all their faces! I wanted to shout at them, "YOU did not save my life, GOD did"!! But I Kept my big mouth shut as I still needed them to treat me into healing



Over the last couple years, we have grown our audience and in 2023 we had an average weekly listenership of 5,380 each week!






