Registration is now open for the 11th Annual Pedal for Protein ride!

Join the 1-day bicycle ride on Saturday, September 21, 2024 for either a 45-mile

loop ride west of US-101 departing at 8:00am or a moderate 11-mile loop ride through Spring Lake Park departing at 10:00am. Both rides start and finish at Presbyterian Church of the Roses (2500 Patio Court, Santa Rosa, CA) and travel on bike trails and less traveled roads.

Registration fee for either ride is \$100 (adult) and \$50 (under 18) and includes pre-departure snacks, lunch and a T-shirt. A feed station will be provided midway along the 45-mile route. All riders are required to arrive one hour before departure for check-in and time to enjoy pre-ride snacks and camaraderie.

In its first 10 years, Pedal for Protein has raised over \$440,000!! All funds raised are donated to Northern California Food Banks for local food pantries and one international hunger relief project. Your participation will help many grassroots food pantries that are struggling to provide quality protein food such as canned tuna, peanut butter, canned beans, yogurt, eggs and more to hungry families, seniors and children along the Northern California Coast from the Golden Gate Bridge to Crescent City, including Napa, Solano and Lake Counties.

A Commentary on Passing the Peace Connecting with Christ's message of peace and each other.

Curiosity about the practice of passing the peace as part of our worship led to the search of some history and context and an article by Rev. Paul Ryan, a mentor and worship leader at Calvin University in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Here are some excerpts from the article.

...One ancient and significant gesture in worship is the passing of the peace. Passing the peace is a tradition rooted in Scripture that embodies our identity as peacemakers (Matt. 5:9. 2 Cor. 5:20) and trains our hearts, hands and tongues in the ways of peace.

From the beginning Christians have exercised this practice. "Peace be with you" is a greeting Jesus him-



self used with his disciples (Luke 24; 36; John 20;19, 26). The apostle Paul opened each of his letters with the words "Grace and peace be with you" (Rom. 1:7; 1 Cor. 1:3; 2 Cor. 1:2).

The gesture is simple, but the meaning is profound. When we extend our hand to another, we identify with Jesus, who extended his life to the point of death to make peace with humanity (Col.1:20-21) ...Likewise, when we regularly pass the peace we practice God's call to make every effort to maintain the bond of peace (Eph.4:3).

It's important at the same time to recognize the cumulative impact of weekly passing of the peace. By regularly practicing this gesture, our hearts are

shaped in the form of the words.

It's understandable, though that passing the peace still might make some of us nervous. Protestants are often skeptical of worship practices that place words in our mouths or enjoin us to obligatory gestures....

...It moves us outside our comfort zone. In that case, what may be needed most when passing the peace is generous hospitality. ...








Each Sunday morning from 7:30-8, we broadcast a 30-minute church sermon on KSRO radio.


